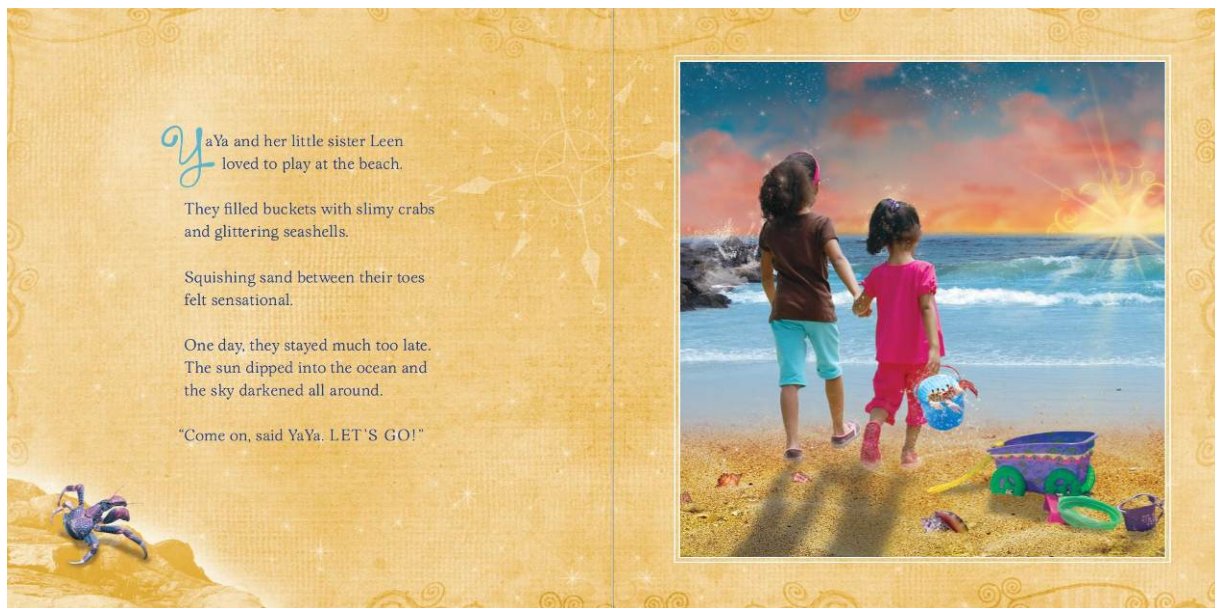
Sunbelievable – A Delightful Story Teaches Children About The Wonders Of The Sun

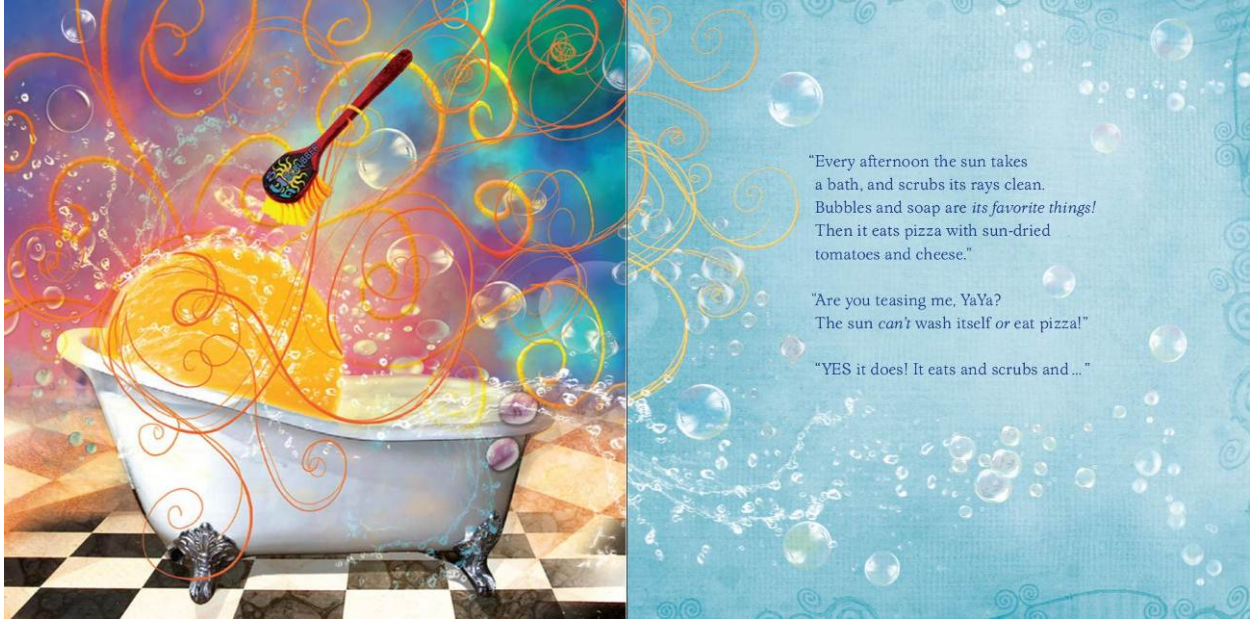
Sunbelievable is a humorous, beautifully illustrated, educational/science children's picture book about the Sun for young children ages 4 to 8.

In a colorful world bounded only by imagination, YaYa and Leen entertain and amuse themselves with all the silliness and fun they conjure up together.

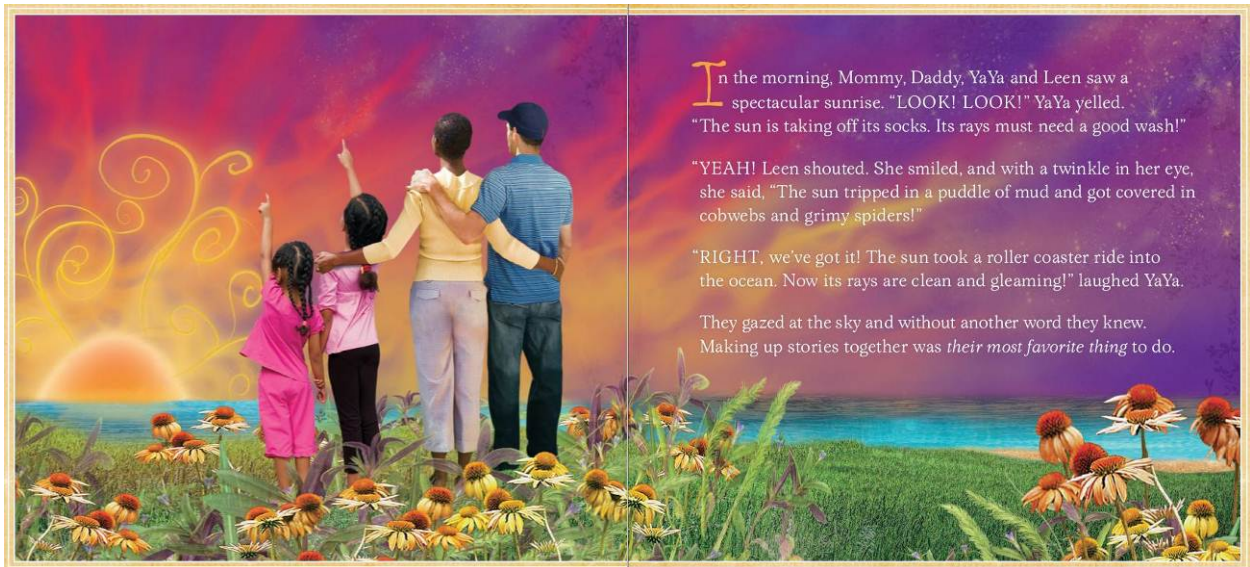

Does the Sun ride roller coasters? Teach fireflies to shine? Take bubble baths when eating pizza?



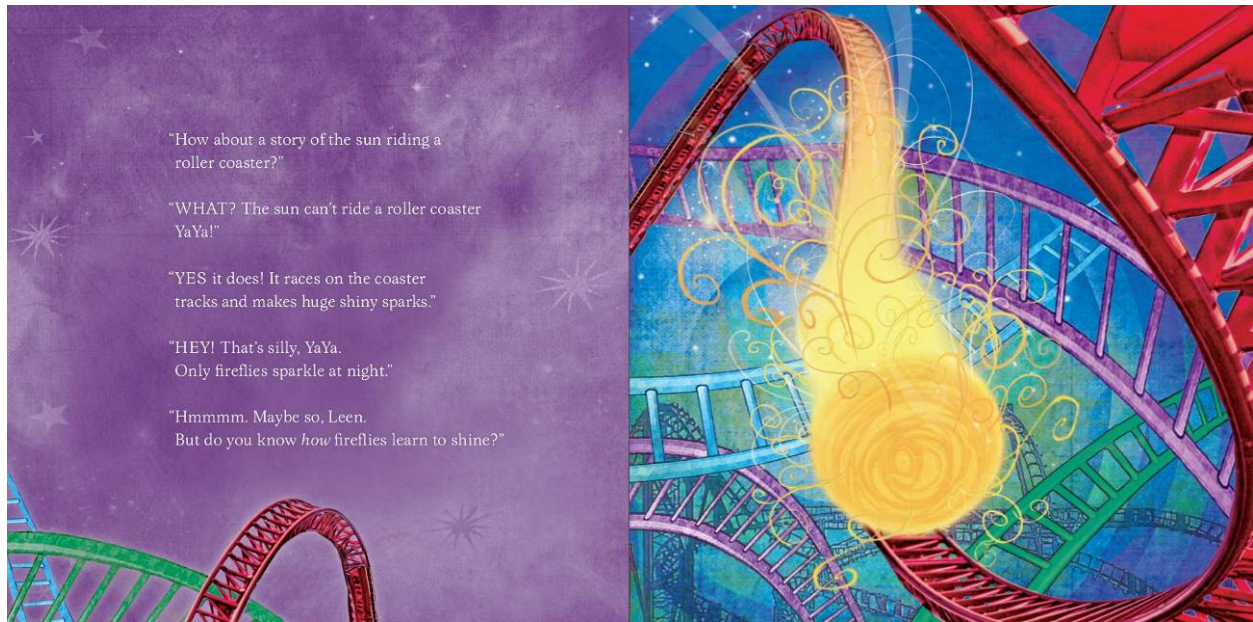

"HEY! That's silly, YaYa. Only fireflies sparkle at night."

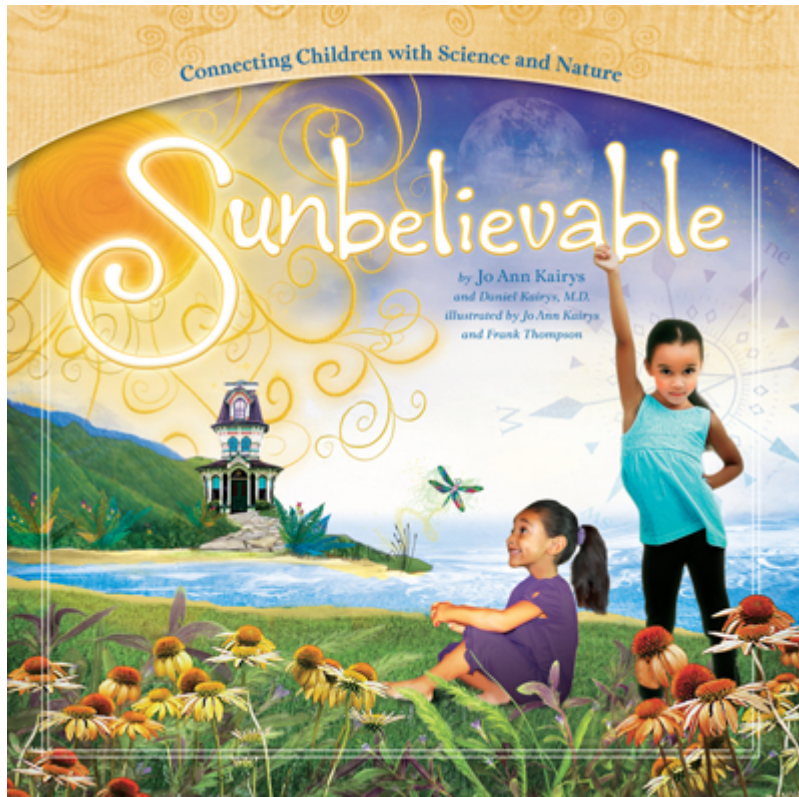
"Hmmm. Maybe so, Leen. But do you know *how* fireflies learn to shine?"

The vividly stylized images use digital photo collage techniques, combining photographs and original digital artwork. Jo Ann's original photographs of children and landscapes from around the world set the stage for this imaginative, wacky story.

When not wrestling gallbladders and appendixes, he spends time inspiring, teaching and loving his wife and four children. He is deeply committed to improving health care for underserved communities, and was one of the first surgeons to arrive in Haiti after the 2010 earthquake.
